

Frame.io Additional Terms

Effective as of August 22, 2022.

These Additional Terms govern your use of Frame.io products and services ("**Frame**") and are incorporated by reference into the Adobe General Terms of Use ("**General Terms**") located at www.adobe.com/go/terms (these Additional Terms and the General Terms collectively referred to as "**Terms**"). Capitalized terms not defined here have the same meaning as defined in the General Terms.

- 1. Collaboration Services.** Through your use of Frame, if you initiate or are invited by another individual or organization that is using Frame under a separate agreement with us ("**Third-Party Account Holder**") to Share or edit Content in a document, space, library, canvas or other collaboration environment (including, but not limited to Adobe Premiere Pro and Adobe After Effects), controlled by the Third-Party Account Holder (each a "**Collaboration Space**"), you acknowledge and agree that the Third-Party Account Holder is solely responsible for implementing the settings, including commenting, editing, access, publication and ownership settings, for all content, including your Content, in the Collaboration Space. The Third-Party Account Holder will be able to restrict or terminate your access to the Collaboration Space at any time. If you do not want the Third-Party Account Holder to control your Content, you should not Share or edit your Content in a Collaboration Space and should maintain back-up copies of the Content. We have no responsibility or liability for any loss, use or misuse of your Content in a Collaboration Space. You acknowledge and agree that (A) we will not be a party to any disputes between you and any Third-Party Account Holder; (B) you will not seek to make us a party to any such dispute, and (C) we will have no liability or obligation to either you or a Third-Party Account Holder for any content, including your Content, subject to such a dispute.
- 2. Outsourcing and Third-Party Access.** You may allow a third-party individual or organization ("**Third-Party**") to access your Content in connection with your use of Frame in order to Share your Content with such third party. In such event, you are solely responsible for implementing the settings, including commenting, editing, access, publication and ownership settings, for all content, including your Content. If you do not want the Third Party to modify, comment on, or engage with your Content, you should not Share your Content with such Third Party, or should ensure that the permission settings are properly tailored to the rights you authorize for such Third Party.
